Elizabeth McAllister is currently consultant in Strategic Planning and Programming, Results Based Management and Public Sector Reform. She was Director of Operations Evaluation Department of the World Bank (now IEG) and Director General of CIDA's Performance Review Branch which included internal audit, results based management as well as evaluation. She led The Rwanda Crisis multi-donor evaluation and follow-up, the OED evaluations of Aid Coordination, Partnership for Africa, Forestry, Gender and the Indonesia country program. She also worked closely with the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Society (IFRC) in developing their approach to a global evaluation. She assisted the Secretary General as an advisor in articulating Strategy 2010 and later developing an approach for its evaluation. She recently undertook in Sudan a major organizational review which led to rethinking the business model for coordination of multiple donor national society development programs and for building the capacity of the national Sudanese Red Crescent Society.
